

Drug Prevention for Family Workers

A practical training programme for anyone working with children, parents of young children, or family support at Health Clinics, Nurseries, Community Centres, Churches etc.

Hope UK is a drug awareness and prevention charity, providing interactive alcohol and drug awareness sessions for children, young people and those who work with and care for them. We have developed training for those working with young children or families in how to prevent and deal with harm caused by parental use of alcohol or other drugs. Course content

The course aims to increase basic knowledge about the effects of drugs, and how parental use may affect children. It focuses on the social effects of drug use, in particular on the family, and gives a number of practical ideas on how to work with these issues. See the outline of sessions overleaf for more details.

Accreditation

The course is a portfolio-based programme of two level 3 units giving 6 credits with the Open College Network London (OCNL), which roughly equates to A-Level standard. The course has been piloted in various settings and we ensure that all training provided meets OCNL standards.

Running the course

The course is delivered over two full days. In addition to attending the course, about 30 hours of work is required to obtain the accreditation. Each learner will develop a portfolio with relevant material, much of which will be gathered during training, but some of which will have to be obtained through using the training in real-life situations.

Costs

Courses you host cost £700 (for the 2 days) plus expenses, with a charge of £10 per learner for materials and £50 per learner for the accreditation (registration and assessment).

'Open' courses (ones where anyone can attend) are charged at £100 per learner with an additional £50 per person if accreditation is required – a minimum of 8 learners is required for the course to proceed.
